Location and access to the Palais

The Palais des congrès de Montréal is located in the heart of the city, directly connected to the metro (Place d'Armes station), to 1600 parking spaces and to the underground pedestrian network.

Access from outside: the main entrance is located at 1001 Place Jean-Paul-Riopelle, Montreal, but you can also access it through the entrances located on Viger West, St-Urbain or St-Antoine West. Directions by car.

Access from inside: the Palais des congrès de Montréal is part of the largest underground pedestrian network in the world, consult the map of buildings connected to the <u>network (RÉSO)</u>.

Cars: There are several <u>parking</u> lots on site and near the Palais des congrès, including:

- Indoor parking (Viger) of 400 spaces on Chenneville, accessible from Viger Avenue West.
- Indoor parking (QIM) of 1200 spaces accessible from St-Antoine Street West.
